Dr. Elaine C. Lacy - Dr. Lacy is Professor of History at the University of South Carolina at Aiken and Director of Research Initiatives for the Consortium for Latino Immigration Studies at the University of South Carolina at Columbia. Dr. Lacy received her B.A. in History from the University of Hawaii, and an M.A. and Ph.D. in History from Arizona State University. After leaving ASU, where she also taught History of Latin America, Dr. Lacy served as research analyst at the Inter-American Development Bank in Washington, D.C., where she examined educational policies in Brazil and Mexico.

Dr. Lacy has lived and studied in both Spain and Mexico, where she developed an appreciation for Spanish/Hispanic language, culture, and history. Her areas of specialization include modern Mexico and Hispanic/Latino immigration to the U.S. Currently, her projects involve Latino immigration and settlement processes in South Carolina and the Southeast. Dr. Lacy is co-editor of a book entitled *Mexican Immigration to the Southeast: Impact and Challenges* (2005), and has numerous articles, scholarly papers, and presentations on Latino immigration to her credit.
