As director , Mr. Rudman is responsible for ensuring implementation of the provisions of the NAFTA, encouraging U.S. companies to take advantage of NAFTA by exporting to Canada and Mexico, and working toward a hemispheric Free Trade Area of the Americas (FTAA). In addition, the Office tracks all bilateral policy issues relating to Canada and Mexico and seeks advice from the U.S. business community on these issues.

Mr. Rudman joined the Commerce Department in September, 2001 after serving for over ten years as a U.S. Foreign Service Officer with the Department of State. He served overseas in Guayaquil, Ecuador and in Montevideo, Uruguay and at the State Department in the Bureaus of Western Hemisphere Affairs, International Organization Affairs, and Intelligence and Research. He last assignment in the Foreign Service was as Brazil Desk Officer (1999-2001).

Mr. Rudman holds an M.A. in Latin American Studies from Tulane University, New Orleans and a B.A. in Government and Spanish from Colby College, Waterville, Maine.
